

Factors that Affect Health Public Health Pyramid

Smallest Impact Counseling and Education

Eat healthy, be physically active

Clinical Interventions Rx for high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes

Long-lasting Protective Interventions Immunizations, brief intervention, cessation treatment, colonoscopy

Changing the context to make individuals' default decisions healthy

Fluoridation, 0g trans fat, smoke-free laws, tobacco tax, iodization

Too many people are misusing/abusing opiates

Too many people are overdosing on opiates

There are not enough treatment options for recovery from opiate addiction

Scope of the Problem

Franklin County

<u>Population</u>: 71,540 in 26 communities over 724 square miles. Second poorest county in the state.

Emergency Department Visits: 1524 patients with alcohol or other substance abuse problems between May 2013 and April 2014.


Opioid Overdoses: 42 between December 1st, 2013 and April 30th, 2014

<u>Arrests</u>: Greenfield Police Department reported approximately 650 arrests in 2013. Current rate has the city on track to reach 1600 for 2014.

<u>Treatment Admissions</u>: In 2010 19% of Franklin County treatment admissions were due to opiates. In 2013 that number was up to 37%.







OPIATE OVERDOSE DATA ANALYSIS 5/10/14






