EDS Updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Irving: Chief Wonkka spoke about a senior-focused flu clinic, which is scheduled for 10/30/21. They are also beginning to plan for COVID booster shots. • Williamsburg: Donna – EDS still connecting with each other either through email or phone. Because there have been West Nile-positive mosquitoes in Hampshire, Hampden, and Franklin counties, Donna put out a message about being careful around mosquito bites and what to do. This meeting has given her the idea of posting vaccine suggestions at the town’s transfer station. As well as on the town’s website and Facebook account. • Shutesbury: Pease said that weekly EDS messaging to the town’s email distribution list was paused for several weeks but has started again. They have sent out emails about COVID as well as mosquito-borne illnesses. • Frontier: Shores Ness – Deerfield had a message board at the transfer station promoting vaccination. UMass students are mostly vaccinated but breakthrough cases are hard to contain because there are students living together. Their challenge is 20-somethings. They’re working on having the state mobile vaccine van go to a football game. They are working to get the mobile vaccine van to the transfer station on the weekend. Senior flu clinic planned and perhaps a booster clinic later. A third of their break-through cases are in children, half of whom have been symptomatic.
